Fall compost pick-up will take place on Mondays for the month of October, except for the holiday Monday. Pick-up will be offered on Tuesday, October 15th in lieu of

Thanksgiving Monday. Please use paper leaf bags instead of plastic bags. When putting out branches, please bundle them into manageable lengths.

The next Large Item Pick-up will take place on Monday, November 4th. Remember no automotive, steel or hazmat items. All items must be registered by calling the municipal office no later than 4 p.m. on Wednesday, October 30th @ 386-2573.

**Final tax bills** have been mailed. The first installment of this bill will be due by September 30, 2019 and the second installment will be due by November 29, 2019. Keep <u>all</u> receipts issued by the municipality. There is a fee of \$25 to provide duplicate copies.

**Fall flushing** of the water mains for general maintenance has not yet been scheduled.

The 2019 Budget was passed by Council with a 4% tax increase.

# For Your Alternative Parking Convenience

You may have noticed the new boat racks at Tom Thomson Park. These are available for parking your kayak, canoe, etc. in between your paddling sessions on our beautiful river. The racks were purchased with grant money through the Main Street Revitalization Initiative.

This funding can only be used for streetscaping and landscape improvements. This funding has also provided our community with new log style bike racks around the village, the flower planters along our

streets, the new dock at Tom Thomson Park and some smaller upgrades to our park grounds.

## Preparing For The Coming Seasons

This is a good time to ensure your outdoor faucet is in good working order or if you don't have one, perhaps you should consider installing one. In recent years, some residents have experienced frozen water pipes. A properly working outdoor faucet can be used when necessary to maintain a steady flow of water to prevent water pipes from freezing.

Residents are responsible for their own plumbing which includes the line from the curb stop to your house.


Additional seasonal suggestions include:

- ◆Clean and inspect your chimney each year.
- ♦ Heating systems should be inspected annually by a qualified technician.

- ◆Install a carbon monoxide alarm in your home.
- Give heaters space, keep them away from anything flammable.
- ♦Use a fire screen around a fire place.
- Allow ashes to cool from a woodstove before putting them in a steel container with a tight fitting lid.
- ◆Change the batteries in your smoke alarms when you change your clocks.

When bears pick up a scent with their keen noses, they will investigate it. If they find bird food, garbage or pet food they will return as long as the food source is available.

Here are a few reminders: put garbage out only on the morning of garbage day, not the night before; put garbage in containers that have tightfitting lids and store it in a bear-proof location such as your basement or a sturdy garage; spray garbage cans and lids with bleach or another strong disinfectant; do not leave pet food outdoors, in screened- in areas or porches.
